

Subject: OJJDP Accepting Applications to FACJJ

The following message and attachments are sent on behalf of Caren Harp, Administrator for the Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention (OJJDP):

Dear Colleagues,

I am pleased to announce we are accepting applications to serve on the Federal Advisory Committee on Juvenile Justice (FACJJ). Composed of members of state advisory groups (SAG) on juvenile justice, the committee advises the President and Congress on matters related to juvenile justice, evaluates the progress and accomplishments of their juvenile justice activities and projects, and advises the OJJDP Administrator on the work of OJJDP. I invite all eligible SAG members to submit an application to serve on the committee.

The FACJJ is an advisory body established by the Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention Act of 1974, as amended. Through recommendation reports, the FACJJ advises the President, Congress, and the Administrator of the Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention (OJJDP) on OJJDP's operations and federal legislation pertaining to juvenile justice and delinquency prevention. I anticipate that the FACJJ will convene in person as many as four times annually with additional meetings held electronically. The federal government will pay travel expenses for members to participate in in-person meetings.

To avoid real or apparent conflicts of interest with FACJJ votes, FACJJ members are expected to sign the attached Certification of No Conflict and Nondisclosure form. In addition, FACJJ members should not serve simultaneously on the FACJJ and the board of directors of any OJJDP-funded organization, and must not be federally registered lobbyists. FACJJ members are statutorily required to be members of their SAG for the entirety of their FACJJ term.
